#### **Crisis Text Lines:**

• 988 (call, text, chat) National Suicide Prevention Lifeline (https://988lifeline.org/) has been designated as the new three-digit dialing code that will route callers to the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline (now known as the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline), and is now active across the United States. When people call, text, or chat 988, they will be connected to trained counselors that are part of the existing Lifeline network. These trained counselors will listen, understand how their problems are affecting them, provide support, and connect them to resources if necessary.

### **Helpful information**

If a family has a child with significant mental health challenges, the family can call the non-emergency 911 to share information about their child. If the child has ASD or other neurological differences, they are able to share this information with the first responders to have their home "flagged" so that in the event 911 is called, the dispatcher will convey to the Crisis Intervention Team. Police may be alerted to not turn on lights or siren, and not to feel the need to use a weapon.
